"Everyday Samaritan: Neighboring Well" October 26th - "Go and Do Likewise"

The title for next Sunday's message comes from the last line of the Parable of the Good Samaritan. This whole month we've been exploring what it means to live out our faith - to not just "say" we believe but to "show" it in the way that we speak to others and treat others. Of course, those actions of love for others aren't "enough" on their own - they must be done in connection with our deep love for God. This Sunday we'll wrap up this series by looking at another scripture where Jesus lays out clearly what is required to be his disciple - and that is to put our faith into action by meeting the real needs of our neighbors without judgement.

I've heard many people this month say that the Parable of the Good Samaritan is one of their favorite scriptures. I love it too! But loving it and living it out are two different things. This Sunday's scripture is a little bit harder to love. It challenges us to see Jesus in the face of the poor - those who are hungry, thirsty and without basic necessities. It challenges us to see Jesus in the face of strangers, those who are sick and even those who are behind bars - people most of us are uncomfortable around for one reason or another. Yet these are the people Jesus identifies with - and calls us to meet HIM as we meet their needs.

I hope to see you in worship this Sunday, as well as at our community meal this Friday and the Tailgate Sale on Saturday!
