Speaking In & Interpreting Tongues

As we near the finish line of this worship series I'm curious to know what you've found most meaningful as we've explored the variety of Spiritual Gifts. Do you feel like you know what your top 2-3 spiritual gifts are and how you might put them to work in the world? If you aren't sure, I'd love to hear from you about what might be helpful for you in the next few weeks - a workshop or Sunday School session dedicated to exploring your specific gifts? This Sunday we'll hear the story of Pentecost from the book of Acts and celebrate the day when the Holy Spirit was poured out on believers and spiritual gifts began to be evidenced. The gifts we'll explore are featured prominently in this scripture - the gifts of speaking in and interpreting tongues. These gifts may make some of us uncomfortable because they feel waaaaay out of our comfort zone. But the Bible is clear that these gifts are given for the same purpose that all the rest are - for the building up of the Kingdom of God. I hope you'll join us, in person or online, to see how God can use these amazing gifts for the common good.

Sunday Scripture

Acts 2:1-10

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. 2 Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. 3 They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. 4 All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

5 Now there were staying in Jerusalem Godfearing Jews from every nation under heaven. 6 When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken.

7 Utterly amazed, they asked: "Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans? 8 Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? 9 Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, 10 Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome 11 (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" 12 Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?"
